HEADSCARF PATTERN

Thanks for coming,
Have a free headscarf pattern!

The ASG was lucky enough to be invited to have a stall at the exclusive Adelaide Fringe Launch Party. We helped decorate with 150m of fabric bunting and stitched up some headscarves for the staff and volunteers. We thought we would share this simple pattern with you. These scarves look great as a headband or as a neck scarf. They're pretty cute tied around a bag handle too! This little project is a great scrap buster, you can use the same fabric for both sides or switch it up and use two different ones!

1. Put together the pattern, simply cut out the two sections and tape the starred ends together. Cut two fashion fabric on the FOLD.
2. With right sides together, stitch around the scarf, using a 1cm seam allowance. Be sure to leave a 5 cm gap on one of the long straight edges so you can turn your scarf the right way out!
3. Press your seams and clip the excess fabric at the corners. Turn your scarf right side out and gently poke out the corners so they are nice and pointy.
4. Now to close that turning gap. You can a slip stitch it closed by hand, machine topstitch that section only or topstitch around the whole scarf.
5. Give everything a final press and admire your fabulous handiwork!
